:: Poppers ::

A discussion with accurate and timely information on the subject of Amyl-based room odorants (often called "poppers"). If you use Poppers when having sex, then this 3-hour information session is for you.

:: Syphilis Update ::

Syphilis can be transmitted through oral sex more readily than HIV and can have serious consequences if left untreated, so it is better to prevent it than to have to treat it. If you want up to date information on Syphilis, then this 3-hour session is for you. (An optional oral test swab will be available on the evening).

:: Criminal Conviction: Right or Wrong? ::

Failure to Tell Partners of HIV Can Bring Criminal Prosecution!

There are a number of issues that must be addressed when prosecuting someone for transmitting HIV. 'Disclosure' is no longer solely up to you and your conscience. At that point, your decisions may have legal implications. Failing to disclose your HIV status to your partners may make you vulnerable to criminal prosecution or to being sued by any sexual partner.

Why am I doing it?

This session will provide an opportunity to talk with other guys who have unprotected sex, and find out the things people practice to reduce their own risks of contracting sexually transmitted infections when having unprotected sex.
